Country Report on animal welfare during long distance and cross-border transport by land

General Veterinary Inspectorate



- Competent Authority responsible for control of animal welfare during long transport in Poland is Veterinary Inspection:
 - DVO is responsible for:
 - control of animals before loding and after unloading;
 - control of vehicle;
 - control of journey time (verification of section I of journey log and control of journey log and data from navigation system after a journey);
 - control of the documets: approval for transporter; certificate for mean of transport; licence of competence
 - BIP is responsible for above mentioned during the control at exit point.
- Road Transport Inspection is a responsible for control of i.e. animal welfare during the transport (they have a poer to stop tha vehicle on the road and perform the controal)

Checks at exit points



- Exit points are the same as BIPs for animals
- Check on welfare is done on the basis of Reg. 1/2005
- Documents:
 - valid authorisation for transporting company
 - Certificate of competence for drivers and attendants
 - Navigation system
 - Transport time not exceeded the time limits
 - Record of welfare check in section III of journey log
 - Check of animals: the space, the condition of animals, water, feed, temperature, etc...
 - Part III of INTRA document in TRACES system is complited.

Minimum standards for animal welfare



- Council Regulation (EC) 1/2005,
- Veterinary Inspection Act
- According to this Act the Veterinary Inspection is respossible for:
- inspection of animals before, during and after their travel specially checking if the animals are fit for travel acc. to chapter I od annex 1 of regulation
- Approval of transporter of animals (short or long distance), certifying the longdistance vehicles
- Certifying the competence of drivers and attendences.

As described Article 7.3.3. point 6 a. of the Chapter 7.3 of OIE TAHC



Standards for facilities, containers and vehicles for the transport of animals are set in chapter II and VI of annex I to Council Regulation 1/2005

Vehicles for long distance journey has to be approved by DVO and *Certificate of approval of means of transport by road for long journeys* has to be issued by DVO.

As described Article 7.3.3. point 6 b. of Chapter 7.3 of OIE TAHC

Competences



According to the Reg. 1/2005 the driver and attendence person has to parrticipate in the course concerning animal welfare during transport. And after the course he must pass the exam what is the basis for issueing the *Certificate of competence for drivers and attendants*

According to the Animal Protection Law the DVO is responsible for:

- certifying the traning centre;
- organizing the exam ;
- issuing the certificate of competence.

Implementation of the standards



The competent authority for implemanting the standards concerning animal welfere is the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development.

The producers or entities can established *Best Practices* but it is not obliged by a law.

Use of veterinary medication



Please describe the responsibility of the Competent Authority in monitoring and evaluating the use of veterinary medications in your country?

The Veterinary Inspection is supervising the using of medication treatment of animals.

As described Article 7.3.3. point 6 g. of <u>Chapter 7.3 of OIE TAHC</u>

Cross-border transport of animals



Please describe the 'procedure' for giving priority for animal consignments at borders to limit unnecessary delays in your country?

There is an electronical system in place at border crosses SOC-T to register all consignments. When consignment of animals arrives is send by customs to veterinary control directly.

When this control is finished (with positive result) it returns to customs and is released immediately.

The consignments leaves the border using priority line.

Reporting significant animal welfare problems



In case of a significant animal welfare problem occurring during the journey in your country, do you report back to the 'sending ' Competent Authorities?

District Veterinary Officer when recognising non conformity in welfare informs General Veterinary Officer. DVO sends with this information all relevant documents relating to animals. GVO analysis the documents and informs competent authority of country (including contact points)

Conclusions



Transport of animals is a very complicated operation and many factors have an influance on it.

The most difficult part is good preparation for unforseen occurences - this is main challenge for transporters and for veterinary services.
