





March 2014- RSPCA initiated first TAIEX mission on animal welfare to Azerbaijan focusing mainly on EU legislation
 Exploratory activities underway in Georgia and Azerbaijan in 2015 with a focus on dog population management.

RAWC 2014 -2015

CVI and RSPCA hosted the first meeting of the regional advisory board 27-28 feb 2014.

<u>The role of RAWC</u> is to provide scientific and expert support regarding Animal Welfare issues to Countries in the Region, based on newest scientific accomplishments, best practices, EU and national legislation and guidelines and OIE recommendations, but keeping in mind regional specificities.

The mission of RAWC is to promote the humane treatment of animals, raise awareness of the needs of animals in order to prevent unnecessary suffering of animals in the Balkan region. The mission of RAWC is to become a centre of excellence in the region to provide assistance to all the major stakeholders in the Balkans towards developing best animal welfare standards and practices.

The vision of RAWC is to work towards the highest possible animal welfare standards through active cooperation and participation of all key stakeholders in the region.

- Steering group (Croatia, Slovenia, Macedonia, Bulgaria, Serbia, Bosnia) met 3 times during 2014-2016 to develop action plan for the region
- RAWC has been formally endorsed by the CVOs in most of the represented countries
- CVI provides secretariat for 2 yrs, RSPCA and CVI funded
- 6-7 May 2015 Workshop in Croatia to disseminate the RAWC results and engage with the wider stakeholder body







- January 2016 SG meeting with the representative of the OIE to discuss the support for the awareness campaign.
- RAWC supported printing and distribution of materials to 7 countries and provided coordination between countries.
- ToR revised and work plan agreed for 2016
- Next annual regional workshop in October (FYROM) 2016 with the focus on family and traditional farms in the region
- Developing a multi species guidance on animal welfare for small farmers and producers
- Completing the expert database
- Setting up stakeholder platforms
