Post Workshop evaluation (on the basis of a questionnaire) indicated that countries have cascaded the training at national level in most cases. 



- V. Network of regional experts on S & T







The OIE engages with a large range of AW stakeholders at international and regional level, to conduct or promote the Platform activities (workshops, support to countries, etc.). A Stakeholder consultation meeting is organised every year to exchange on respective AW activities in Europe and create synergies and complementarities.

The OIE also encourages the OIE Delegate to consult Stakeholders present at national level. Countries are notably invited to establish a stray dog multistakeholder Advisory Group (or a national stakeholder framework) as stated in article 7.7.5. of the OIE TAHC.


