


RSPCA working with other partners, local authorities, and the equine industry t tackle the problem of fly grazing and horse abandonment.


The hire ID system as to be better enforced and the central Equine database is to be established as 70% of the horsed picked up are not identified.

Works is being carried out with the traveller communities and dealers to encourage improvements and fly grazing.


