



Regional training



Veterinary focus — 3 training sessions in Latin

- <u>Countries</u>: Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Panama
- <u>Participants</u>: Government vets, community vets and members of the local communities
- <u>Aim</u>: To empower veterinarians to survey and support equine welfare through their work
- <u>Content</u>: Working equid welfare and link to human livelihoods – up to 2 day training plan



Work done



Nicaragua

- 20 participants
- Good potential for the OIE working equid chapter to influence government policy makers

Costa Rica

- 15 SENASA (government) veterinarians
- Active participation throughout

Work done

Panama

- Numerous participants university staff, MIDA staff (veterinary government body), university students and agrarian school students
- Panama as the sub-regional headquarters for the OIE and could be an excellent point of reference for the regional activities
