


Animal medicines help ensure health




Good animal health is a precursor to animal welfare





Think about it...




The availability and the success of mastitis treatment has a positive impact on the welfare of cows, has prevented unnecessary culling and has also greatly improved milk quality.





Think about it animals get sick too & deserve to be treated



Pneumonia is a common disease (despite vaccination) of different farm animal species, but it is much more serious than the coughs and colds which spread through groups of school children: if left untreated it can spread through the herd and animals will often die.



The EU Animal Welfare Platform:

promoting dialogue on animal welfare issues relevant at EU level.



AnimalhealthEurope supports the EU's <u>cooperative</u> <u>approach</u> to promote animal welfare on the international scene.

In particular, we play our role in raising awareness on animal welfare, particulary focusing on the impact of an animal's health status and available treatments on welfare





AnimalhealthEurope supports EU animal welfare initiatives - <u>examples:</u>

- Member of the EU Platform on Animal Welfare
 - Focus on enforcement of EU welfare rules and standards
 - Further development of voluntary commitments
 - Active measure to promote EU animal welfare standards
- Partner in European Partnership for Alternative Approaches to Animal Testing (EPAA)
 - Pooling knowledge and resources to accelerate the development, validation and acceptance of alternative approaches
- Member of the European expert group on piglet castration





Examples of areas of direct interest

- 1. Animal transport: impact of movement of animals on disease transmission
- 2. Offering alternatives to surgical castration of piglets, via immunocastration
- 3. Protection of animals used in science: regulatory
- requirement to conduct testing for approval of products

In ovo vaccination can help to protect the baby chick in the early stages of life

Further measures reduce the risk of exposure to infectious diseases:

- Hygiene & housing
- Good nutrition
- Herd health planning with a vet




...what impact on animal welfare ???


